

Year ended June 30, 2023

(Unaudited - See Notice to Reader)

Nature of the Society

The Kinsmen Rehabilitation Foundation of British Columbia (the "Society") is a not-for-profit organization incorporated under the Society Act of British Columbia. The Society is a registered charity under the Income Tax Act and, accordingly, is exempt from income taxes, provided certain requirements of the Income Tax Act are met

The purpose of the Society is to provide funding and services and technologies empowering British Columbians with disabilities to live more independently.

1. Basis of Accounting

The basis of accounting applied in the preparation of the financial information on the historical cost basis, reflecting cash transactions, with the addition of the following:

- Accounts receivable less any allowance for doubtful accounts
- · Investments recorded at cost
- Accounts payable and accrued liabilities

2. Restricted cash

Restricted funds for endowment purposes representing The Kinsmen Foundation of BC Extraordinary Needs Endowment Fund in the amount of \$1,070,530 (2022 - \$995,530) is invested in the Consolidated Trust Fund. The funds are held in perpetuity with Vancouver Foundation acting as trustee. Income distributions from the fund are to be paid annually each year. Market value at June 30, 2023 is \$1,147,532.
